Coggin SOS provide a refurbishment service for office furniture Old laptops and phones can be donated to the Restart Project for community re-use and there are lots of companies that will collect redundant office furniture. Once they finally die, and are not suitable for charity donation, electrical items should be recycled rather than being put in general waste. This will avoid the risk of them ending up in landfill. 	Build sustainability considerations into purchasing decisions for new equipment & furniture	We would suggest trying to apply a bit of a hierarchy here, along the lines of: 1. Reduce – avoid over-purchasing or replacing items unnecessarily. Coggin SOS provide a refurbishment service for office furniture. 2. Re-use – are there any items which could be purchased second-hand or refurbished? For example, through internet auction sites or from specialist suppliers of refurbished products such as Backmarket for electrical goods and Coggin SOS and WantDontWant for office furniture. 3. Recycle – investigate the sustainability of the materials of new products you purchase, e.g. look for high levels of recycled content in plastic/metal items or components, ensure all timber is FSC-certified. 4. Look at the environmental credentials of the manufacturer/supplier – e.g. do they publish a clear environmental policy? Do they have any form of accreditation? Do they measure their carbon footprint?
